What is the Northeast BARJ Drop-In Center?

The Northeast Balanced and Restorative Justice Drop-In Center is a multifaceted facility, encompassing a satellite probation office and an alternative to detention for medium to high risk pre-adjudicated juveniles as well as post-adjudication juveniles who may be pending revocation. The Drop-In Center provides services in a structured, community based environment that facilitates family support and involvement. The duration of participation is sixty days.



The Northeast Satellite Office is responsible for the supervision of Court involved youth in the Northeast quadrant of the District. This includes Police Service Areas: 103, 501, 502, 503, 504, 505, 601, 602, and 603, which includes Clay Terrace, Trinidad, Lincoln Heights, Edgewood and the Aquatic Gardens areas of Northeast, DC. The staff participate in monthly PSA meetings in collaboration with the Metropolitan Police Department, primarily in Wards 5 and 6.

The Family Court Social Services Division focuses on the strengths, weaknesses and needs of the individual within the context of the family. This perspective assumes that problems within the family are a contributing factor to the child's success in the community and, at worse, are a major factor in the child's involvement with the Court. Therefore, the Family Court Social Services Division has implemented a family group conferencing initiative which requires all youth entering the juvenile justice system to participate in a Family Group Conference.
